

WARBLER RIDGE

Just at the edge of the Wisconsin glacier's furthest southern reach lies the rolling ravines of Warbler Ridge Conservation Area. This 1059-acre area is a compilation of preserves owned and managed by Grand Prairie Friends. Warbler Ridge is part of an extensive forested corridor running along the Embarras River for more than thirteen miles. Warbler Ridge extends from Warbler Bluff (north of Lake Charleston) south to Fox Ridge State Park.

Visitors are invited to walk among the 11-miles of meandering hiking trails. Trailheads and parking areas are located at Bypass Road, Daileyville Road and 550N, as indicated on the map.
